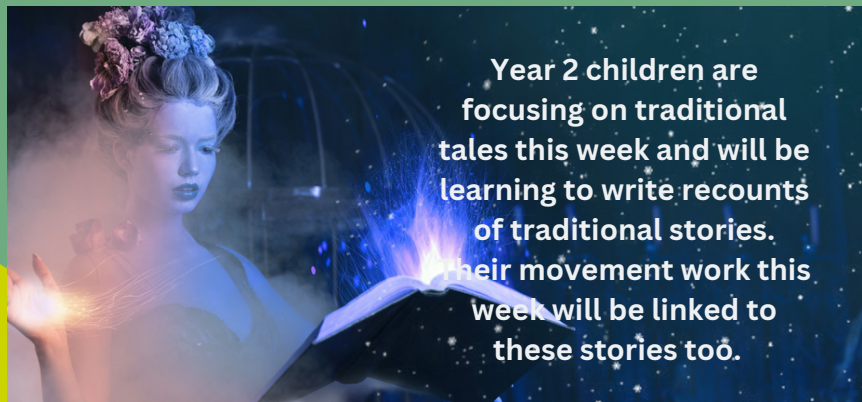
Having completed their Baseline Assessments, Early Years children can now begin the business of learning for real.

Year 1 children will be looking at the Three Little Pigs text. Don't be surprised if they huff and puff!

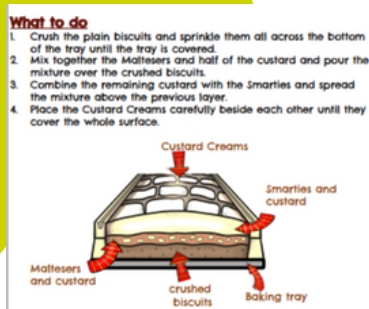
Year 1 are learning about where they are in the world. They'll be looking further afield and studying different types of building in Daventry town centre.



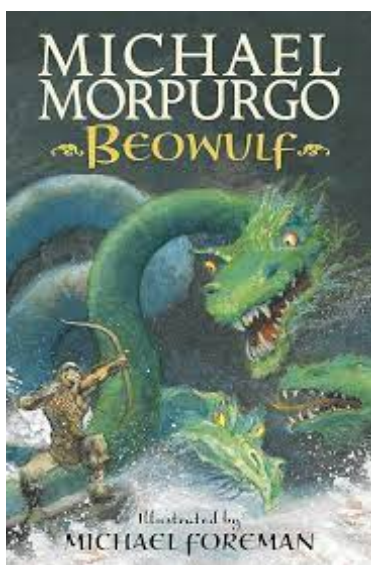
Year 2 children are focusing on traditional tales this week and will be learning to write recounts of traditional stories. Their movement work this week will be linked to these stories too.
