

# What to do...

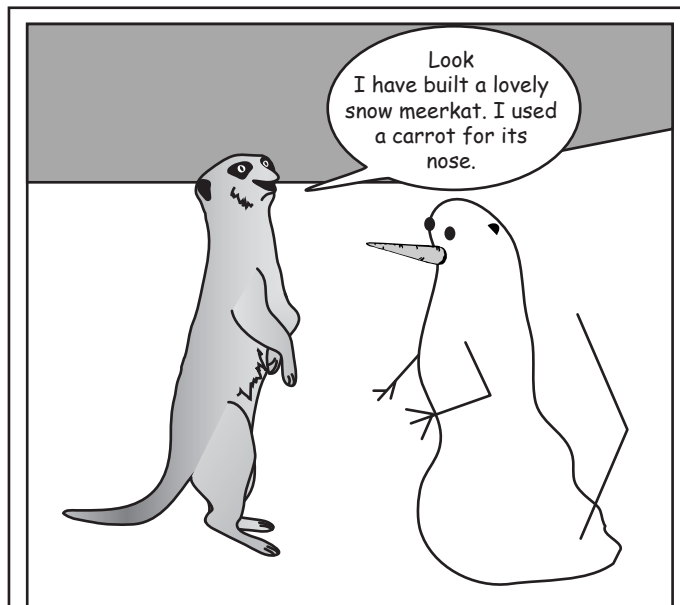


## Snow time!

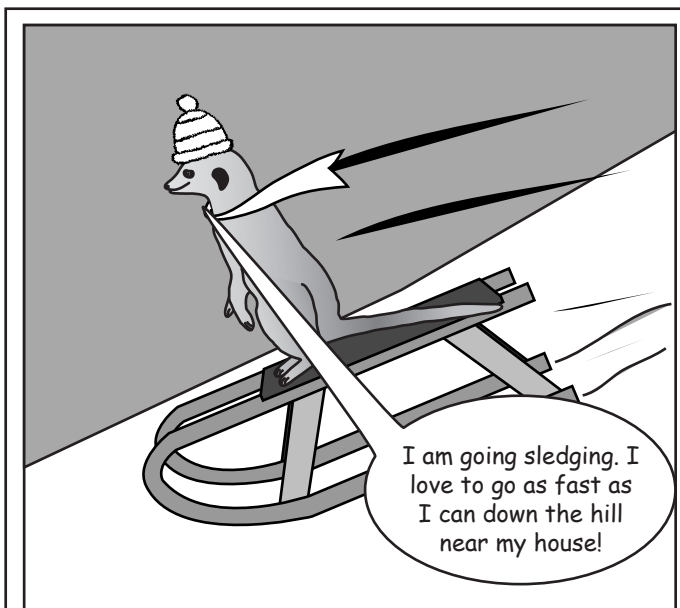
