EYFS children are completing Baseline Assessment in maths before beginning their mathematical learning journey.




In the Early Years, children will be continuing to settle into their new school 'family'; building relationships with adults & other children, including their 'buddies' from elsewhere in the school.


They will also be learning the British Sign Language signs for family members and reading the book shown



here.




Year 1 are learning about where they are in the world. They will look at the area immediately around the school. Ask them about their book too.




Year 2 children are continuing to learn about Goldilocks and The Three Bears. They'll be reading and making simple maps this week and writing character descriptions.

It's all about the Roman army in Year 3 this week. In History, the children will be learning about the power and might of the Roman army. They will learn what it was like to be a Roman soldier and English work will be based on this too. Year 3 children will even be creating dances based on centurions.





Henry VIII - fair king or tyrant? Year 4 children will be learning about probably the most famous king in British history and making their own minds up about him! They will of course be learning about Henry's wives. Ask them what they know. The children will also begin to learn formal Tudor dances this week.





Year 5 children are continuing to read the story of Beowulf and will begin to learn more about the period in history this tale comes from. They will learn what Britain looked like after the Romans left and will be setting the scene for learning lots more about Anglo-Saxon life. Year 5 dance this term will also be based on their history learning.

Year 6 children will continue learning about the Ancient Islamic Empire. They will complete both history and geography work to gain a deeper understanding of the empire. Their RE work will also help them to understand this civilisation more. Some Year 6 children will be swimming this week, whilst others will take part in two in-school PE lessons.
