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School Uniform Policy

Introduction

It is our school policy that all pupils wear school uniform when attending school or when participating in a school event outside normal hours.

Aims and Objectives

Our policy for school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school
- Engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school
- Is practical and smart
- Makes pupils feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- Is regarded as suitable wear for school and is considered by parents as good value for money
- Is designed with health and safety in mind

The Role of Parents

We ask parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and that it is clean and in good repair. It is parents responsibility to ensure that all items of school uniform are clearly named.

The Grange School Uniform policy is set out below.

Boys – Winter

- Dark grey or black school trousers
- White school polo shirt
- School sweatshirt
- Black or grey socks
- Black shoes (NO obvious trainers)

Bovs – Summer

In addition to the above, boys may wear the following during the summer months:

- Dark grey/black shorts (not sports shorts)
- Navy blue school cap

Girls - Winter

- Dark grey/black knee length skirt or pinafore dress
- Dark grey/black ankle length trousers
- White school polo shirt

- School sweatshirt
- Grey or Navy blue cardigan
- Black, grey or navy tights
- White, black, grey or navy socks
- Black low heeled shoes (NO obvious trainers)

Girls - Summer

In addition to the above, girls may wear the following during the summer months:

- Blue and white gingham or striped school dress
- Navy blue school cap

Physical Education (PE)

- Plain black/ dark blue shorts
- White school PE T-shirt or plain white T-shirt

All in a named PE bag please.

Uniform Rules

Children may wear:

- 1. Sensible inexpensive wristwatches, but should be marked with the owner's name. The pupil must be responsible for their watch as the school is not responsible for damage or loss of personal property.
- 2. Hair decorations may be worn, provided they do not cause any safety concerns.

These should be appropriate for school and should be removed for PE. Hair that

can be tied back, should be please.

Children should NOT wear:

- 1. Jewellery should not be worn. Piercings are not permitted. Should children attend school displaying piercings, the school will engage in a conversation with parents about this.
- 2. Make-up, including nail varnish.
- 3. Trainers (except during PE/games lessons).
- 4. Sports branded clothing during the normal school day.
- 5. High heeled shoes (on health and safety grounds).
- 6. Extreme haircuts. Should children attend school with what is considered to be an extreme haircut, the school will engage in a conversation with parents about this.

7. Tattoos of any description - including temporary tattoos.

Purchasing School Uniform

Sweatshirts, polo shirts, school caps, PE kit and bags can be purchased from the school office.
