





A FOCUS ON BEHAVIOUR



WHAT OFSTED SAID (JULY 2022):

BEHAVIOUR AND ATTITUDES ARE GOOD

A focus of the OFSTED inspection was behaviour, and the team thoroughly inspected standards in this area. They observed behaviour in classrooms, on the playground and around school. They spoke to lots of children and parents. Here's what they found:

'The Grange School is a warm and friendly school.'

'Pupils enjoy their learning and are proud of their school. They know that staff care for them and listen to them.

This helps pupils to feel safe.'

'Staff commit to knowing each pupil individually. Relationships between staff and pupils are positive. Pupils are polite and respectful. They play happily together during their breaktimes. Pupils behave well and the atmosphere in school is orderly and calm. Pupils know that bullying is not tolerated, and they know that staff are quick to deal with any concerns.'

As always, we are keen to improve further and so, joined the Behaviour Hubs Programme in April of last year.

Over the Summer Term, we reviewed our Behaviour Bands, in attempt to make them more simple for the children to understand. We launched these in July and have revisited them already this term.

Parents tell us they want to be informed as soon as possible if their child's behaviour deteriorates. Whilst it is not appropriate to tell you of every small incident that takes place, we will tell you if your child's behaviour is causing concern. This could be by telephone, face to face or via a letter from the Behaviour Lead / Head Teacher.
