The Grange School has an outstanding reputation for music making and we currently offer lessons on all main instruments and voice during the academic year.

Lessons are provided by the Northamptonshire Music and Performing Arts Trust (NMPAT). Teachers make 33 visits to the school during the academic year.

Learning an instrument is an exciting and valuable experience that can lead to an enjoyable life-long skill. We currently offer the following:

- The number of lessons per term is as follows: Autumn term II lessons, Spring term II lessons, Summer term II lessons.
- The price for lessons has been set for the 2020-2021 Academic year at £58 per term (subsided cost.)
- I understand that I make this commitment for the whole academic year 2020-2021.
- Tuition Fees are payable at the beginning of each term and can be made via ParentMail either termly or on a monthly basis or can be taken off your pupil premium card (soon to be issued.).
- In the event that the teacher is unable to attend the lesson it will be made up at a later date or the cost refunded if this is not possible.
- I am aware that my child will be placed on a rotational timetable and will need to leave subject lessons to attend music lessons.
- If my child decides to discontinue lessons under exceptional circumstances, I will need to inform the finance office, in writing, at least one term in advance. Email bursar@thegrange.northants-ecl.gov.uk
- Insurance. The parent/guardian is responsible for the insurance of the student's instrument. Parents should be aware that any damage to a student's instrument on site will not be covered by the school's insurance.
- Examination entries, music book costs and instrument repairs are paid for by the Parent.
