



How should my child travel to school?

- I We are urging you (at the request of the UK Government) to walk to school please. Daventry has a network of appropriate pathways and so we believe it is safe and appropriate to do so.
- 2 If you have to travel to school on public transport, you must follow national guidance on face coverings.
- 3 We urge families not to provide lifts for each other, as this further increases mingling between bubbles of children.
- 4 We need to reduce the number of cars in the front of the school please. We have requested to close the access road at the start and end of the day, but we (along with many other schools) have been refused permission to do so.
- 5 The pathways at the front of the school are needed for parents and children to queue. We will have markers in place to help you know where to go, and you should expect queues to be long, but fast-moving. We kindly ask that you move away quickly once your child has entered the grounds. Our risk assessments show that we have minimised risks to an acceptable level. However, the fewer cars that are using this area, the better. We are kindly requesting your support with this.
- 6 As always, all traffic regulations outside of the school should be adhered to please.
- 7 We are advised to promote safe travel but it remains the responsibility of parents to ensure that national guidance is being followed outside the school grounds. Social distancing must be adhered to please. Your continued support with this is very much appreciated.
