





Learning Project WEEK 2 - Where I live

Age Range: EYFS (Seedlings, Saplings and Reception)

These are aimed at giving you some ideas and structure. Please feel free to complete as much or as little as your child wishes to. Gardening, cooking, playing with water and playing alongside your child have just as much value. If you wish to share any learning with your child's teacher, please take a picture and upload to Class Dojo.



- Draw some numbers 0-10 on the floor with chalk, can they jump on the correct number? Can they throw a beanbag or ball to the correct number. Reception children, you could give them an addition e.g. 4+5, can they jump on the answer?
- Play board games, can the children count the spots on the dice? Reception children, use 2 dice, add the numbers together.
- Make a dice and draw the dots on it. Cut out a template like this and fold and stick together. Roll the dice and find the correct amount of toys.



- Make pasta necklaces, how many pieces of pasta do you have? Can you make a repeating pattern by colouring or painting the pasta?
- Collect some sticks, stones and leaves. Can you make a repeating pattern along the floor?
- Use a little pot of water and a paint brush. Make some patterns outside on the ground.

- Reading a variety of books at home. Your child could share a book everyday. This can be reading a book aloud everyday or sharing a book with an adult.
- Listen to a story read, <u>Storytime</u>.
- Draw a story map of your favourite story.
- Using puppets or toys, can your child make up a story for you to write?

- Weaving cut out a cardboard shape and wind some wool around it. Can you weave smaller items through the wool? like feathers, pipe cleaners, leaves and sticks.
- Draw a picture of your house. Reception Can you label it? Roof, window, door, bricks etc.
- Reception children Do you know your address?



The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of where they live. Learning may focus on what you live in, favourite rooms in the house and where you live.



<u>Where I live</u>

This is time to find out about where we live.
What do you live in? Talk about your home. How many rooms has it got? Who lives with you? Which is your favourite room? Why is that? How long have you lived at that house?
What is your address? Who are your neighbours? Who lives next door?
Draw a picture of your house.

Maps -

Look at different maps. Can you spot Daventry? Where is Daventry? What is the country called that we live in? Can you draw a map of your journey from home to school? What do you pass along the way?

<u>Data detective</u> Ask your child to talk about each room of the house and write a list. Ask everyone you live with to tell you their favourite room in the house. Where do other things live?

Talk about animals and where they live. Draw the animal and where we would fine them. E.g. fish, dogs, tortoise, elephants.

Can you find any insects in the garden/ outside space? What have you found and where do they live?
