

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

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Academisation - Questions & Answers

Can schools be forced to be an academy? Schools which have received two or more consecutive ratings below 'Good' may be converted into academies.

The Secretary of State for Education has sent the school something called an 'academy order', which will start the process for the school to become an academy.

In these circumstances, schools will be transferred to a trust with a strong track record of ensuring pupils receive the highest standard of education.

When will all this happen?

It's already happening. The process begins as soon as an academy order is issued. However, academy conversion is a long process, with many stages to complete. The process usually takes approximately 9 months to complete.

Do we know which trust we will join? No, but as soon as we do, we will let you know.

Will parents' views be taken into account? Again, no. The DfE have agreed to allow the Head Teacher & the Chair of Governors to give opinions on possible trusts, but no-one from the school will be involved in the final decision.

Rest assured, we are doing all we can to ensure that the chosen trust is the right 'fit' for our school.

Will there be lots of changes?

Change is inevitable and there will be changes. However, it's important to remember that there are always changes from year to year. In order to get better, schools need to make changes for the better.

Again, we will ensure that all changes are communicated to you.

What will those changes be?

At this early stage , we just don't know. It will depend upon the trust selected. Again, you will be informed as soon as it is appropriate to do so. Members of the chosen trust will meet with staff, parents and children when the time is right.

What next?

We wait for the DfE to tell us which trust they have chosen.

*** UPDATED - NEW INFORMATION ***

Our school day now runs from 08:45 - 15:15 each day.

Reception children should aim to be at the classroom door for 08:45 please.

For the Summer Term only, children will not be marked late until after 08:50, but gates will close at 08:45.

We know that some of you are finding the transition to this new arrangement difficult. Please remember that staff are doing what they have been asked to do. We do not tolerate any abuse of staff members. School gates open at 08:40 and staff are on the playgrounds to help children to go straight to their class lines. Teachers will be waiting at the head of their class lines.

School start time is 08:45 and children should be lined up on the playground at this time. Staff lead the children in straight away and gates are locked almost immediately. Please encourage your child to line up quickly.

Please do not deliver messages to members of staff at this time, as it prevents them from supervising the children and slows down the process of entering school. Urgent messages should be left at the front office or be sent via DoJo.

You are welcome to talk to school staff directly at the end of each day.

Dear Parents / Guardians,

With a rapid increase in temperature over the last few days and more hot weather expected in the coming weeks and months, West Northamptonshire Public Health are reminding parents and guardians of the importance of following heat safety advice to protect their child / children from high temperatures and worsening hay fever symptoms.

Sun protection

During this warmer weather, keeping your child protected from the sun can help to avoid risks of over sun exposure such as dehydration, heat exhaustion or fainting. Ways in which you can keep you child protected includes:

- Apply SPF factor 30+ sun cream before your child/children go outside and reapply at least every 2 hours. If your child is playing with water or in a paddling or swimming pool, ensure to re-apply sun cream immediately after they finish playing.
- Children should always be supervised when playing with and around water, even in shallow depths or when they are wearing buoyancy aid such as arm bands or a rubber ring.
- Ensure they drink plenty of fluids ideally water but sugar free drinks are also suitable.
- · Keep your child/children covered with loose fitted clothing a sun hat and sunglasses.
- · Avoid the sun between 11am 5pm, when the sun is at its strongest.

If your child gets sun burnt, carry out after-care as quickly as possible to help reduce the severity of the burn. This can include taking a cool bath or shower or sponging the sore skin with cool water, applying aloe vera to keep the skin moisturised, drinking plenty of water and avoiding further sun exposure.

Heat stroke can affect anyone who is out in the heat, even for a short time. Symptoms can include displaying an altered mental state, confusion or not being able to walk correctly. If this happens you should try to cool the child down as quickly as possible by getting them out of the sun and applying or spraying cool water.

Hay fever

Warmer weather can aggravate hay fever symptoms due to the increased levels of pollen circulating in the air. If your child is prescribed hay fever medication or an inhaler, it is important they take this before going outside.

Contact your local pharmacy for further advice and treatment if you are unsure if your child has hay fever but they start to experience any of the below symptoms:

- sneezing and coughing
- a runny or blocked nose
- · itchy, red or watery eyes
- itchy throat, mouth, nose and ears
- headache
- feeling tired

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

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
Only 2 weeks left until show day!




Curriculum Focus



The Senior Leadership Team of Mrs Masters, Mrs Wagg & Mrs Waldock have been refining and tweaking our school curriculum .








THE GRANGE SCHOOL
